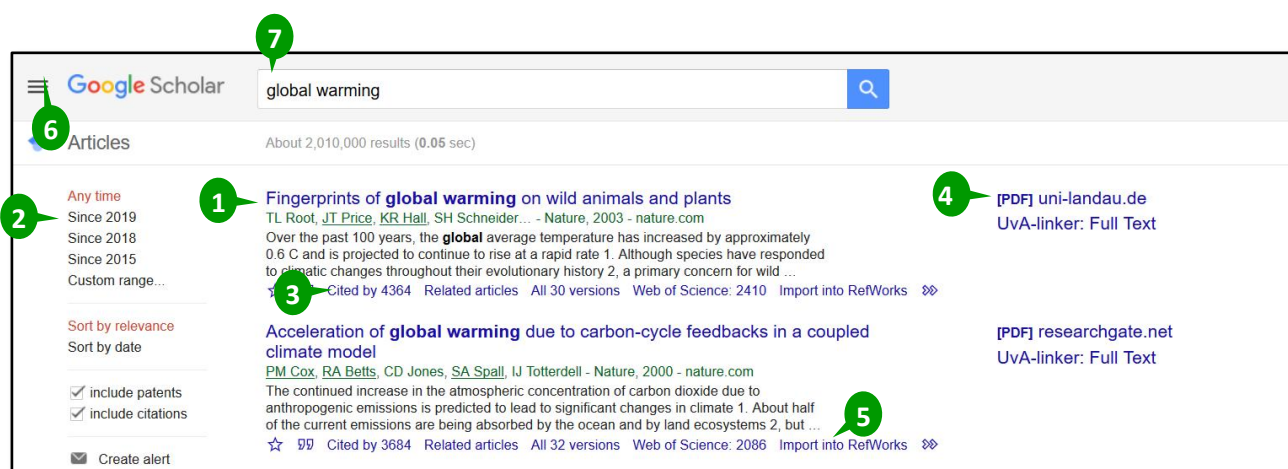


# Google Scholar

Searching for academic publications? Google Scholar helps you find what 'ordinary' Google can't.



- 1 Find publication**

Click a search result for an abstract or the full text, if available. A link to Google Books usually leads to a preview instead of the full text.
- 2 Recent research**

Set the date to find publications from that year onwards.
- 3 In-depth: citing and related publications**

The link *Cited by* will find publications which cite this publication. *Related articles* finds publications on the same subject.
- 4 Read the full text**

On the right you can see if a publication is available as a PDF file. Click *UvA-linker: Full Text* to check if the publication is available – digitally or in print – via the UvA University Library. If there is no UvA-linker button on the right, click *More* (the 2 arrows under the title).
- 5 Save titles**

Via *Import into RefWorks* titles are quickly saved in RefWorks. Go to *Settings* (via the 3 dashes at the top left) to set RefWorks as your preferred *Bibliography manager*.
- 6 Advanced search**

Use *Advanced Scholar Search* (via the 3 dashes at the top left) to search by author, journal in which an article is published and/or publication date.
- 7 Extra search tools**

Phrase search ["global warming"] gives a more specific result than [global warming]. Exclude: ["global warming" –politics] finds publications on global warming in which the term politics does not occur.
